ODSTOCK is a parish in the hundred of Cawden and Cadworth, Alderbury union, Salisbury county court district, South Wilts, distant 3 miles south from Salisbury station, and 98 from London, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and deanery of Chalke. The living is a rectory, annual value, with residence, £282, in the gift of the Earl of Radnor; the Rev. Charles Grove, M.A., is the present incumbent. The church is named St. Mary. Southward of the village is Clearbury Ring, a considerable eminence, supposed to have been a Roman encampment. Population, in 1851,181; with 1,220 acres.
