

Marlborough Bride Married at Preshute November 1949

Wise, 88 Bath Road, Overton, Marlborough, a radio and television engineer, employed at Morse's Ltd., Swindon, was on Saturday, at Preshute Parish Church Marlborough, married to Miss Enid Claire Cook, younger daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. J. Cook, 43 Cherry Orchard, Marlborough.

The choral service was conducted by the Vicar, the Rev. Peter D. May, and the organist was Miss F. M. Smith.

Given away by her father, the bride wore an ivory gown of crepe-de-chine, with overskirt of old Brussels lace train, long white embroidered veil and halo of orange blossom. She carried a bouquet of red roses.

The two bridesmaids, Miss Irene Douglas (brides cousin) and Miss Mary Sturgess (bridegrooms cousin), wore full-length gowns of sea green moiré taffeta, with sequin studded cuffs and lapels. They wore head-dresses of silver leaves with pink net should veils, and pink mittens, and carried bouquets of pink chrysanthemums.
