Legacies of Mr. Robert Highlett

The will and codicil of Mr. Robert Highlett, late of Pewsey, gentleman, who died on the 1st of September, have been proved at the Salisbury District court of Probate Registry by his executors, the personalty being sworn under £8,000.

The following charitable bequests were made by the deceased, viz.: to the vicar and churchwardens for the time being in the parish of Burbage, Wilts, £500, to be invested in Government security, and one moiety of the interest or dividends applied in aid of the funds for the support and maintenance of the "National School established at Burbage for the education of the poor children of that parish in the principles of the Established Church."

The other moiety of such interest is to be devoted annually to the purchase of coals, to be given to the needy and aged poor of Burbage in the month of December in every year.

Deceased also bequeaths £100 stock each to the British and Foreign Bible Society and the Church Missionary Society after the death of his niece.
