My Lord

Will your Lordship condescend to present the inclosed petition, to the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

I am my Lord Your Lordships Most Obedient Servant Joseph Alexander

To the King's most excellent Majesty

In the case of John Alexander now a convict in Isherton Gaol, Wilts, under sentence of transportation for life, for sending a threatening letter to Ann Chandler.

We the undersigned, most humbly implore your Majesty to extend your royal Clemency, to the above convict. The young man had always maintained a good Character, and the deed for which he is now under sentence, was rather the effect of indiscretion, than any malicious motive. The Prosecutrix was allied to him, and was also his Godmother and for whom he had always entertained the highest respect and veneration. To mitigate as much as possible the griefs of his afflicted family, and to hold out to them the prospect, that by a commutation of his punishment, he may not be lost to their sight for ever, is our humble and earnest request and your petitioners as in duty bound
