Pitton and Farley Inclosure

We the undersigned, the Commissioners appointed in and by an Act of Parliament lastely passed, intituled, "An Act for inclosing lands in the parish of Pitton and Farley, in the county of Wilts," do hereby give notice, That we shall hold our first meeting for the purposes of the said Act, on Monday the third day of September next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, at the house of Samuel Gibbons, called or known by the name or sign of the Spread Eagle, in the city of New Sarum; at which said meeting the majority in value of the proprietors who may be present are to chuse a banker, or some other person or persons, in whose hands all monies to be raised under and by virtue of the said Act are to be deposited, pursuant to the directions of a certain other Act of Parliament, passed in the 41st year of the reign of his present Majesty, commonly called the "General Inclosure Act." Given under our hands this first day of August 1810
