1823

1832

1833

At Potterne, Mr. John Dowse of Easterton, to Ann, only daughter of Mr. Biggs of Potterne Park, Wilts. **Berkshire Chronicle**, **5 January 1833**

1841

On Saturday last, at Potterne, at an advanced age, Mrs. Wilkins, relict of Mr. Robert Wilkins of Potterne. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette**, **11 February 1841**

1842

On Saturday last, Mr. Robert Watts, of Potterne, aged 81 years. For 60 years he served the office of sexton and clerk to the parish of Potterne, and was much respected by all who knew him. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette**, 12 May 1842

1846

Died. On the 8th instant, at Potterne, Miss Hester White, aged 74. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 16 April 1846**

1847

Died, March 25, at Potterne Manor House, in this county, Julia, Oldest daughter of Lieutenant Colonel Olivier, aged 22. Salisbury & Winchester Journal, 3 April 1847

1848

Married, April 27, at Berry Narbor, Devon, Charles Henry Wyndham, Esq. late 7th Hussars, and youngest son of the late William Wyndham, Esq., of Dinton, to Eleonora Ann Julia Hunt, eldest daughter of the Rev. James Brubbe, of Eastwell, near Potterne. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday, 6 May 1848
