

Kellys Directory Extract 1915 Potterne



POTTERNE is a parish and village in a small and sheltered valley, 2 miles south from Devizes station on the Great Western railway, in the Eastern division of the county, hundred of Potterne and Cannings, petty sessional division, union and county court district of Devizes, Potterne rural deanery (Potterne portion), archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury. The village chiefly consists of two streets, the principal of which runs north and south, on the road from Devizes to Market Lavington and Salisbury. The church of St Mary, an ancient cruciform structure of Bath stone, dating from the 13th century, is a fine example of the Early English style, and consists of chancel, nave transepts, north and south porches, and a central embattled tower with pinnacles, and containing 6 bells; the chancel contains a piscina and an aumbry: there is another piscina in the north transept: the oak pulpit is hexagonal and exhibits some elaborate 15th century carving: the small doorway in the tower staircase, which admitted to the rood loft, remains but is now blocked: the east wall of the chancel has an arcade of 5 arches, three of which are pierced and filled with stained glass, as memorials to Joseph and Dionysia Melionora Medlicott, and to the Rev. Joseph Medlicott, for 33 years, vicar of this parish: twelve other windows are also stained, two being memorials to Lt Col Henry Stephen Olivier d. 1864, one to Col Thomas Wilson Oldfield, d. 1872, and two others, erected in 1905, to the late William Stancomb esq.: a font of the 9th century or even earlier date, found buried under the present font, bears an inscription which is a Latin version of part of Psalm XLII: in the transept there are many brasses and tablets to the Hunt-Grubbe family, and a small brass to Hugh Rook ob. 1686: there is also a mural monument in the nave to John Spearing, d. 1831: the church was restored and reseated in 1872 at a cost of £2000 and affords 430 sittings: a dole stone still stands in the churchyard, outside the north door. The register dates from the year 1557. The living is a vicarage, net income, including the value of 22 acres of glebe, £380, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held since 1911 by the Rev. Walter Hercules Kewley MA of Magdalen College, Oxford, and rural dean of Potterne portion. A burial ground, adjoining the churchyard, of about three quarters of an acre, was formed in 1872 at a cost of £900 and is under the control of the Parish Council. Here is a Wesleyan chapel, a Mission Room used by the Plymouth Brethren, and a Temperance Hall, erected in 1876. An institute was erected in 1908. The charities amount to about £100 per annum. Blounts Court, the seat of William Stancomb esq. MA JP is a modern castellated mansion of stone, standing on an eminence, commanding a fine view of the surrounding country. The Manor House is the residence of Joshua Reynolds Gascoigne Gwatkin esq. MA. JP. The Porch House, formerly a roadside inn called "The White Horse" is an antique timber and plaster house restored by the owner, the late George Richmond esg. RA, DCL, and now the property of C H St J Hornby esq. The Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as owners of the Salisbury Bishopric estates are lords of the manor, and William Stancomb esq MA, JP is the principal landowner. The soil is greensand and clay in parts: subsoil chalk with part clay. The parish contains 3187 acres of land, principally devoted to pasturage; rateable value £7414; the population in 1911 was 1145.

Worton and Marston now form a separate parish.

Cuckolds Green is 1 mile south-west; **Five Lanes** 1 mile west; **Sleight** 1.5 miles east; **Whistley** 0.75 miles north-west; **Furze Hill** (common land) 1.5 miles north; **Woodbridge** a quarter of a mile east: **Wick** half a mile south; **Stroud Hill**, 1 mile east.

Elementary School, built in 1831 and endowed by the Rev. George Edmondstone, formerly vicar of this parish with about £27 yearly. In 1865 the schools were rebuilt and considerably enlarged and an infants school has since been added, and in 1895, both schools and the playground were further enlarged: they will now hold 157 boys and girls and 55 infants. George E Stoakes, master: Mrs Stoakes, mistress.

A motor omnibus passes through from Lavington to Devizes Thurs. and Phillips, from Marston, Thurs.
