At whole special Direction this Monument was erected. After a long Life passed in inerary
Pursuits, his End was accompanied with Acts of Benevolence, of which his Relations and
Friends were the Partakers: Nor were the Poor omitted in his Benquefts: as the divers Sums
given by his laft Will to the Hofpitals of Sarum & Bath, the Society for the Benefit of Clergymen's
Widows and Orphans in the Diocefe, the Needy in this and neighbouring Parishes besides
other charitable Donations, form Teftimony.

He left also to Merton College in Oxford, of which he was formerly Fellow, all his valuable
and extenfive Library, together with an handfome Sum for its Augmentation.

Mrs FRANCES FERRIS and Mrs MARY NORRIS, the Adminiftrators to his Will, have directed
this Infcription to be engraved, as a Mark of their Gratitude and Efyem for the Deceased.

IN A VAULT NEAR THIS PLACE ARE DEPOSITED THE REMAINS OF

THIS MONUMENT WAS ERECTED BY HIS EXECUTORS IN CONFORMITY WITH HIS WISHES
AND AS A LASTING TRIBUTE OF THEIR GRATITUDE AND RESPECT
AND OF THEIR DEEP SENSE OF THIS INTEGRITY AND UNIFORM KINDNESS TO THEMSELVES
HIS TENANTS AND DEPENDANTS
IN THE SAME VAULT ARE ALSO DEPOSITED THE REMAINS OF CHARLES SPEARING ESQ., HIS
BROTHER
