Completed in March 1905
1910 sold to the Furness Railway Company and renamed PS LADY MOYRA
WWI requisitioned as a paddle minesweeper, commissioned 21 Nov 1915 – 9 Jul 1919 as HMS Lady Moyra and operated mainly in the Irish Sea.
Sold after the war to the Tucker Yellow Funnel Fleet, returning to the Bristol Channel
July 1922 purchased by P and A Campbell at auction for the White Funnel fleet.
1933 renamed PS Brighton Queen
WWII requisitioned as the Paddle Minesweeper HMS Brighton Queen in September 1939

1 June 1940 sunk by air attack off Dunkirk, on her second trip to evacuate troops.
