Memorial Committee Meeting minutes of 23 November 1920 recorded that "Mr. E. Hampton here tendered a petition from Mr & Mrs Gwatkins and was requested to read the heading which dealt with the placing of their sons name onto the memorial"; "The Chairman explained that as Chairman he could not receive this petition as it was not addressed to him"; "That the Committee confirm their former resolution, and greatly regret that they do not consider Lieut. R. Gwatkins name eligible for the Memorial and

this was carried" (Source: WSHC).
