Josiah Parker, George Prater, George Thatcher and William Dance, four boys, were charged with stealing two pairs of gloves and a handkerchief, from the person of two pupils of Marlborough Grammar School, on Sunday afternoon last, 26th August, at the parish of Preshute. The young gentlemen were walking out in the afternoon in a lane near to Marlborough, when they were stopped by the four boys, who demanded their money of them. The answer was, "We have got no money." The prisoners then said, "We must have what you got about you." Admitted to bail, to appear on Saturday, 1st September, to answer the charge.
