

## Swindon & District Directory Extract 1928 Braydon, Purton



BRAYDON is a hamlet to the west of Purton. The area of the hamlet is 1.484 acres; rateable value, £1,250; population, 67. Through the exertions chiefly of the late Rev. D. O. Coates, the spiritual needs of the inhabitants were provided for by the erection in 1868 of a building on a plot of land presented for this purpose by the Earl of Suffolk. The church has been removed, and now stands near the school. The services are conducted by the Vicar of Purton. The Primitive Methodists have a chapel constructed of corrugated iron.
