Axford



A Tithing in the parish of Ramsbury, Axford is 3½ miles from Marlborough and 2 from Ramsbury. The Vicar of Ramsbury conducts services at a Chapel of ease in the village, and there is a Wesleyan Chapel. Sir Francis Burdett, is Lord of the Manor. Letters arrive through Marlborough, which is the nearest Railway Station and Telegraph Office. The wall letter box is cleared at 10 a.m. And 5.55 p.m. Ramsbury is the nearest Money Order and Telegraph Office. Postal orders are issued at Axford Sub Post Office.
