



Rowde 1700-1799

(Devizes) TO BE SOLD BY AUCTION

At the Black Bear, in Devizes, on Thursday the 28th day of July 1768, at Four in the afternoon, in separate lots.

The messuage and several closes and pieces of land lying in the parish of Rowd, near the Devizes, after mentioned, viz.

A messuage and close of pasture at Rowd Hill, containing three acres and a half, in the several occupations of John Redman and Richard Pritchard, at several yearly rents, amounting in the whole 6 L.

Two pieces of meadow ground lying in Swillow Mead, containing one acre and a half, in the occupation of Richard Pritchard, at the yearly rent of 3 L.

A close of pasture called bar Furlong, containing six acres, in the occupation of John Walker, at the yearly rent of 12 L.

Two closes of pasture called Whitelands and Sinverlands, containing in the whole eight acres, in the occupation of William Halcomb, at the yearly rent of 14 L.

N B. The premises are all freehold, and Sinverlands, Whitelands, and the lands in Swillow Mead, are free from payment of great tythes.
