Chicken wire sculptures of WW1 servicemen unveiled at cathedral

Three chicken wire sculptures which depict World War One servicemen have been unveiled in Salisbury Cathedral.

The commemorative sculptures of a soldier, sailor and pilot are in recognition of the human losses endured during the Great War and the continuing work of Armed Forces charity SSAFA to support the servicemen and women and their families through the war and every conflict

All three of the sculptures have been created by 83-year old amateur artist, Peter Lovegrove.

The figures were unveiled SSAFA Wiltshire on Monday and will stay in the cathedral for the Remembrance period, along with Wiltshire Council's Wall of Remembrance, a wall of 10,000 crosses made by thousands of school children across the county which each represent a Wiltshire soldier killed in the Great War.
