United East India Company, for five years, are desired to apply to the Company's Recruiting Officer, at the sign of the Cherry Tree, Salisbury, where they will enter into the present pay; and when on board shall be fitted out with cloathing, bed and bedding, with One Guinea and a Half in money, at the Company's expence. Their pay is 10d. per day, when in camp 1s. 8d. They have liberty to return at the end of five years, and their passage paid by the Company. Each man will have a copy of his agreement, signed by the Justice of the Peace to take with him.

All men are desired to come sober.
