ECCLESIASTICAL INTELLIGENCE

We have been informed that Robert Joseph Phillimore, esq., D.C.L., and barrister at law, the chancellor of the Diocese, and the Venerable William Edward Hony, B.D., conjointly been pleased to appoint Messrs. Yarham and Richards of Salisbury, their somners of apparitors(?) for the several Deaneries which have recently become vacant within the above mentioned archdeaconry. The offer above alluded to be one of great antiquity, and is so called from that principal branch of the deities of a somner or apparitor which consists in citing persons to appear in the ecclesiastical court as well as at visitations of the ordinary, which are holden at fixed times and places within the Diocese. Having understood that the above appointment has been most deservingly bestowed, we have much pleasure in recording it in our columns.

The Lord Bishop of Salisbury and the Honorable Mrs. Denison are still sojourning at Swanage, and are not expected to return to the palace until nearly a fortnight from this time. It will be seen from an advertisement in another column, that his Lordship has engaged to preach at the reopening of Tilshead Church, in this County, on the 15th instant.

The next ordination of the Lord Bishop of Salisbury has been fixed to be holden in the Cathedral Church of Sarum on Sunday the 20th instant. The confirmations throughout the county, in which due notice has been given, commence shortly afterwards.

The visitation of the Very Reverend the Dean of Sarum has been holden during the present week at Mere, Sherbourne, and Dorchester, before the Venerable Archdeacon Hony, the Dean's official. At the conclusion of divine service at such place the secular business of the visitation was transacted in the usual manner. During the present month the visitation of the Dean will be holden at several other places within his peculiar jurisdiction in other parts of the diocese of Salisbury.
