To Postmasters and Others

Such Persons as may be desirous to Contract for the daily Conveyance of his Majesty's Mails between Salisbury and Knoyle, in a light cart constructed for that purpose (not to carry passengers, it being contrary to law, and subjecting the Driver to a month's imprisonment), are requested to give in their proposals, in writing, at the rate of so much per annum, to George Stow, Esq., Surveyor of the General Post Office, on or before the 5th of April next.
