St Nicholas Hospital, Register of Admissions and Admonitions

John Ownton (Owton)

March 16th 1607, Admonished for brawling and thefte.

September 7th 1608, Admonished the 2 tyme for brawling and disobedience to the Maister of the house

19 Decembris, Anno Domini 1608. Johannes Owton, propter expilationem aerarij publici fratrum, et alia crimina in quibis se reum esse confitetur, expulsus est ab hac domo, et ab omni iure, libertate, et commodo eiusdem, in presentia Magistri Smegergill capellani, et eidem concessus est vsus loci sui in dicta domo ad mensem, pro discessu suo, ex gratia Custodis. per me Galfridum Bygge Custodum, per me Will'm Smegergill Capellanum, John Owttonn

[19 December, in the year of our Lord 1608. John Owton, on account of the plundering of the national aerarij brothers, and he confesses to be guilty of other crimes in which he had, this was driven out from the house, and of any right, freedom, and advantage of the same, in the presence of the Master Smegergill chaplain, and that for the vse of the concession is of itself in the local the said house to the month, on behalf of his departure, from the grace of the Warden. Geoffrey Bygge keepers by me, by me Will'm Smegergill Chaplain, John Owttonn]
