whatsoever to and for her own proper use and benefit subject nevertheless to the payment of all my just debts funeral Expences and to all legacies by me hereinafter given and bequeathed (that is to say) I give and bequeath to William Light Bennett of Hartgrove the sum of one hundred pounds to Mr John Light Bennett Mr Thomas Light Bennett and to Miss Martha Light Bennett Brothers and Sister of the above William Light Bennett I give five guineas each for a ring To Mrs Diana Tatum Widow of the late Thomas Tatum Esquire I give and bequeath my gold watch and seals To her sister Miss Ann Shuckburgh I give and bequeath my small diamond handkerchief pin also a Ring cyphered E.S. To Mrs ffrances Wyche Wife of Hezekiah Wyche Esquire I give and bequeath the sum of twenty guineas and my ring set with pearls in the memory of her late friend Mrs Mary Ivie To my Servant Ann Goodfellow (if living with me when I die) I give and bequeath the sum of twenty pounds and my wearing apparel To my other Servant Elizabeth Pike (if living with me at my death) I give ten Guineas with four guineas to each for mourning And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint the said Mary Ann King sole Executrix of this my Will and hereby revoking all former Wills be me at any time heretofore made I do declare this only to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I the said Sarah Vaughan have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty six Sarah Vaughaw
