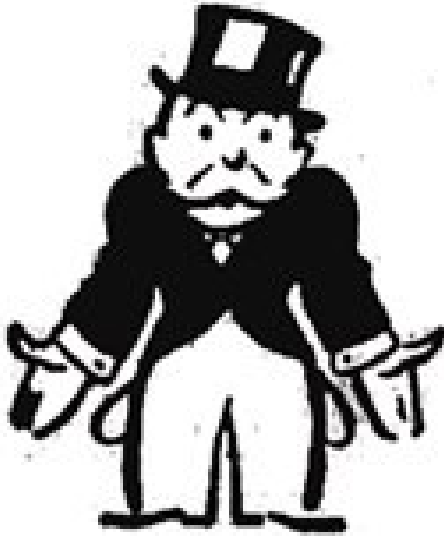

The creditors who have proved their debts under a Commission of Bankrupt awarded and issued forth against Thomas Biggs the younger, of Seend, in the county of Wilts, cheese dealer, are desired to meet the assignees of the estate and effects of the said bankrupt on Tuesday the 18th day of October instant, at three o'clock in the afternoon, at Mr Thomas Nalder's, the Kings Arms Inn, Melksham, Wilts, to assent to, or dissent from, the said assignees commencing and prosecuting one or more action or actions at law, or suit or suits in equity, against Thomas Biggs the elder, of Seend aforesaid, yeoman; and also to assent to, or dissent from, the assignees commencing prosecuting, or defending, any other suit or suits at law or in equity, for recovery of any part of the said bankrupt's estate and effects; or to compounding, submitting to arbitration, or otherwise agreeing, any matter or thing relating thereto, and on other special affairs. --- Ste.
