

Mr Henry Hungerford Ludlow-Bruges, JP.

The death occurred at his residence, Seend House, near Devizes, on Saturday, of Mr Henry Hungerford Ludlow-Bruges, JP, at the age of 56 years. The deceased belonged to a well-known county family. He was the youngest son of the late Mr William Heald Ludlow-Bruges, JP, and DL, Wilts sometime MP for Bath and Devizes and chairman of Quarter Sessions for North Wilts. Mr H H Ludlow-Bruges, who was educated at St John's College, Oxford, was placed on the Commission of the Peace in 1886. He was a lay member of the Salisbury Diocesan Synod.

The funeral took place on Saturday of the late Mr H H Ludlow-Bruges at the family vault at Seend Churchyard. The cortege was met at the church gates by the vicar (the Rev Canon Thynne) and the surpliced choir. The mourners were Miss Ludlow-Bruges, Mrs Wyndham, Mrs Gale, Miss Gale, the Earl of Aberdeen (who was lifelong friend of the deceased), Mr Huxtable, Mr S B Dixon, and the servants at Seend House. There was a large attendance of magistrates and others, including the Chief Constable of Wilts (Capt Sterne, RN), Major Mackay, Major Gwatkin, Messers H E Mendlicott, J F Stancomb, A Stratton, E D B Locke, A G Smith, G W Barroll, A Schomberg, J T Jackson, A Grant-Meek, Drs Mackay and Keir, and a large number of members of the Seend Friendly Society, of which the deceased was president. There were numerous floral tributes.
