Whereas we, Elly Rawlings, Job Rawlings and William Truman, all of the said parish of Seend in the said county of Wilts, labourers, did, on Saturday the 20th day of March last past, riotously assemble at the house of Thomas Biggs, known by the name or sign of the Bell, in the said parish, and on his refusing to draw us liquor, did assault, abuse and ill-treat him the said Thomas Biggs in his house.

Now we do hereby declare, that we are truly sensible of our offence and of the obligations we are under to him for not prosecuting us for the same; and we do hereby publicly beg his pardon, and faithfully promise never to be guilty of the same, or any like offence for the future.
