

Seend Funeral Notice

Mrs Adelaide Mary Marsh

The death on Tuesday at 6 Powlett Road, Bathwick, Bath, of Mrs Adelaide Mary Marsh brings to light the interesting fact that not only did she spend her whole life in Bathwick, but she was born only a few yards from the house in which she passed away.

At the bottom of the garden of 6 Powlett Road, there stood a cottage of the type that, prior to the development of this part of the Bathwick Estate, was very familiar in the locality, and it was in that cottage that Mrs Marsh was born. She was well known in the city in her capacity as a private nurse. Her husband Mr William Marsh, a native of Seend, near Trowbridge, died 24 years ago.

She was baptised and married at St John's church, Bathwick, and with this place of worship she had a lifelong and very devoted association. She was a member of the St Mary's Mothers' Union.

There is a family of three - Mrs Vennell, Mr Robert Marsh and Mrs Lawrence Marsh. A brother of Mrs Marsh – Mr George Lawrence Dainton – is in Australia. He was formerly an engineer at the Tramways Power Station at Walcot and had the misfortune to lose a hand.

Vespers were read at St John's Church on Thursday afternoon; there was requiem mass at 9 o'clock this morning and the funeral service took place at half past 10.
