



Chippenham Market Place

WHEREAS, at Chippenham fair, on Thursday the 29th of October, 1789, a person, dressed in a light coloured great coat, did agree for and purchase a GELDING belonging to Mr. James Jefferies, about fourteen hands high, a light small star in his forehead, sprig tail, with saddle marks, and rode the same from the door of the Bush House, leaving another inferior in his stead, without paying the money agreed for.

Whoever will give intelligence of the above gelding to Mr. Jefferies, at Seend, Wilts, so that he may be had again, shall receive One Guinea reward.
