The 'Daily Chronicle' says that the new ironworks at Seend, in Wiltshire, which after taking three years to build, were opened a month ago, were destroyed by fire yesterday. They belonged to Messrs Merry and Cunninghame, Scottish ironmasters, and their equipment was of the most modern type. The damage is estimated at many thousands.
