List of Deserters & Absentees from the First Regiment of Militia - Division of Melksham and Tinhead......John Harris, Seend, Never Joined Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 28 August 1803

1809


Whereas the several persons undermentioned, being duly enrolled to serve in the Second Battalion of the Local Militia of the county of Wilts, did not appear at Devizes on Monday the 15th day of May instant, being the time appointed for the training and exercise of the said battalion, and have not since joined, whereby they are deemed Deserters.

A reward of twenty shillings (as allowed under the Act of Parliament, will be paid to any person or persons who shall apprehend either of the said deserters, and give notice thereof to Adjutant Robert Hughes, Head Quarters, Devizes.

Devizes May 24 1809..... Samuel Howell, of Seend, formerly of Hindon, labourer, 5ft 71/2in aged 21, stout, grey eyes, dark complexion, brown hair..... Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 29 May 1809

1812

Whereas the several persons undermentioned, being duly enrolled to serve in the Second Battalion of Wiltshire Local Militia, did not appear at Devizes on Monday the 23rd day of September, 1812, being the time appointed for the training and exercise of the said battalion, and have not since joined, whereby they are deemed Deserters; a reward of twenty shillings, as allowed by Act Of Parliament, will be paid to any person or persons who shall apprehend any of the said deserters, and give notice to the Adjutant, at Headquarters, Devizes...... John Barnett, of Seend, aged 30, 5 ft 7½ in high, stout person, hazel eyes, dark hair, sallow complexion...... Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 17 February 1812



1831

Lieut. William Paget, RN, of Seend, in this county, is appointed to his Majesty's ship Isis, of 52 guns, at Chatham, which shop is to bear the flag of Rear Admiral Frederick Warren, CB.
