

RNLI - House to house and Devizes Flag Day Collection: May 2015

Thank you everyone from Seend, Seend Cleeve, Martinslade and Bulkington for giving your time and effort to collect for the Life Boats. Here are the results. The figures in brackets show last years totals. Percentages are rounded to the nearest whole number.

In the village we collected £464.43 (£565.22), 17.83% lower than last year. The total house-to-house amount for all areas was £4803.65 (£4586.19), 5% up on last year. The Flag Day in Devizes raised £759.48 (£741.75) higher on last year by 2%. This was very good considering that there were eight fewer collectors than last year. The average per person on flag day last year was £23.17; this year it was £25.32. So – despite the lower number of collectors, we did very well indeed.

Thank you once again, everyone, for another outstanding effort for a worthy cause supported wholly by charitable contributions.

Maureen's Ramblings.....

What has the Church of England ever done for me? This was a question "The Telegraph" posed a while back. Of course the church has its struggles. That's true of any human institution. But apparently 59% of people in England and Wales call themselves Christian and 85% visit a church in any given year, whether to give thanks, pay respects, mark a significant moment or seek solace. One man, visiting a Cathedral at Christmas said, "I'm not a believer, but I'm here because this place is beautiful; it fills me with a sense of peace and a sense of history". When a child goes missing, or the floods come, it is often the parish church that provides a rallying point. 1.7 million people go to church each month, and the church is part of the warp and weft of our national life with the faith of Jesus Christ deep in the soil of our history. Church weddings may not be as popular as they were (sad because the venues and care from the clergy are good and the costs reasonable), but there are still 54,700 a year and apparently that number is rising again. Anglicans are still the automatic hosts for state occasions and have a role in the political life of our country, working for the benefit of everyone, not just its members. It was William Temple who said that "The Church is the only society on earth that exists for the benefit of non-members."

I believe that this is the unique calling of the church – to be there for everyone, whatever their faith or none, whatever their need. When she heard that a cyclist had been hit by a lorry outside her church the local vicar rushed to the scene, persuaded the police to let her through their cordon and knelt to pray beside the body of the dying woman, commending her to God's mercy and care. The cyclist's husband asked her to take the funeral and she was able to walk with him through his grief. She said, "Parish priests and the church building are available for the whole community, not just for those who attend church regularly." If'I had room I could tell you so many stories of the church, mostly without fanfare, seeking to serve and minister where there is need. Our local churches in our benefice seek to do the same.

The Church lacks the money and the people to put a "professional" into every parish as it once used to, so much of the work is done by faithful, hardworking volunteers who apparently give about 23 million hours every month to work that benefits their local community - night shelters, youth and children's work, food banks, credit unions, housing trusts, legal advice, street patrols, bereavement counselling, visiting the elderly, sick and housebound, lunch clubs, etc. Of course, many other denominations and many atheists and agnostics work just as hard. But nobody else has the same kind of national network, or the historic connections with their communities.

You might not go to church, but please be assured that the church is here for you anyway. You don't have to sign up as a member to use the church to celebrate the birth of your child, marry, renew your vows or have a funeral or memorial service for a loved one who has died (where there is a comforting atmosphere and no time constraints!). You don't have to be a member to discuss what you believe or don't believe or to rant and rave about God. The church exists to serve. The church is here for you. You just need to ask!

The Revd. Maureen Allchin (01380 828931)

The Revd. Maureen Allchin would like to thank everyone who made her Licensing Service as Priest in Charge (Rector) of the Benefice such a special occasion. What is the difference between a Vicar and a Rector? There is really very little difference. Historically the Rector was the person with the right to "the living" (i.e. the money from the church land) and his job (it always was a "him") was the spiritual oversight of the church and community. Sometimes, this meant that Rectors were quite wealthy. Some chose to employ others to do some of the work for them. These men would do the job of the Rector, working "in place of" the Rector. The Rector was carrying out his work vicariously through these other men and became known as Vicars. Our Benefice historically has a Rector. What about Priest in Charge? Again, there is no difference in rank, training or capability. It just means that a parish is subject to "pastoral reorganisation." The Bishop deploys a priest to oversee the parish while the decisions are made about the longer term future of the parish.



SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

N.B. These notes are from the draft minutes of Parish Council meetings, and may not yet have been ratified.

The meeting held on Tuesday 28th April 2015 was attended by nine Councillors with Mr J Padfield in the chair. Apologies received from Mr K Rigg and Cllr J Seed.

Police and Local Councillor's Matters - PCSO Wilson said there was little to report. On 1st April there had been a vehicle collision outside the Post Office. At Semington a cyclist had been knocked off his bike and injured. A kayak and paddle had been stolen from Clears Farm, but had been recovered. As reported in local newspapers, eight men had been taken from a travellers' site at Semington, four have since returned, and three persons are on bail. PCSO Wilson promised to send information on Clear Water for marking items.

Mr Murch raised the issue of payment for green waste bins, and it was agreed to ask for further information from Cllr Seed at the Annual Parish Meeting.

Winter Snow Preparations – An email had been sent to the Parish Clerks of Bulkington and Poulshot. Bulkington will discuss at their Annual Parish Meeting on 15 May, and Poulshot will discuss at their next meeting on 5 May. There was a query whether Mr Breach would be paid by Wiltshire Council if Seend asked him to come and spread grit on icy pavements, rather than to deal with snow. The Clerk to check with the Severe Weather Team at Wiltshire Council.

Neighbourhood Plan – Mrs A'Bear reported that a further meeting had taken place and, having spoken with Community First, she requested funding support from the Parish Council for further meetings and advertising materials in the form of leaflets, corex boards and a banner; the total required was expected to be around £100. After the consultation period was complete, should things progress to a Parish Plan, then application would be made to the Area Board for capital funding. Mrs A'Bear reported that there are currently 11 people on the steering group. It was important to make people in the village aware that they can influence what happens in the village. The consultation meetings will take place on Wednesday 24 and Saturday 27 June in the Irene Usher Pavilion. Councillors voted unanimously to fund the advertising materials and meeting costs.

Car parking Rusty Lane – The Clerk had not yet obtained quotes as she had been busy with end of year accounts preparation. Three quotes would be obtained and suggested contractors are Bodman, Thornbury Surfacing and Valetta (Westbury).

Notice board outside Post Office - This was now ready to be reinstalled.

Footpaths – Footpath 24 – The Footpaths Warden has been advised that it is alright to go ahead with installing a kissing gate.

Parish boundary at Bowerhill –The Clerk of Melksham Without PC has been advised of Seend PC's decision, which will be passed on to the Council. She advises that BRAG (Bowerhill Residents Action Group) has installed an information board in the picnic area with another to follow. Another bench is to be installed on the bridleway. BRAG has indicated to the PC that they wish to donate these items to Melksham Without Parish Council for their ongoing maintenance and insurance.

Bollands Hill – Mr Hawkins had emailed to propose that the road be narrowed at the canal bridge. Councillors discussed, but did not agree with this proposal.

Accidents in Seend – A response has been received from Dave Pretty at Collision Statistics, with a map of accidents in Seend up to 31 December 2014. The information has been passed to Mr Manning.

Footpath School Road – Email received from Ann Ewing to thank the Parish Council for arranging for the clearing of the verge and pavement down Bollands Hill to Pelch Lane, saying it is so much easier to walk down there safely now both with dogs and children. She also expressed her thanks for the new kissing gates that have been installed to replace stiles.

Ash die back – Tree Warden (Aldetha Raymond) has been asked if there was any prospect of replacements for affected trees; no response received to date.

Planning Matters

15/02779/FUL Little Thornham Farm, Trowbridge Road

Removal of existing single garage. Proposed garage and vehicular turning area. Proposed timber entrance gates with stone piers.

Councillors voted 8 to approve, with Mr Nichols abstaining from voting.

15/08703/FUL Wych Elm, Seend Hill

<u>Amended Plans</u>: Change of use from domestic garden to tourist accommodation, involving the siting of a single log cabin and timber storage shed.

Councillors voted unanimously to reject this application. There are a number of points to the application that are still not addressed:

- Is the proposed scheme for disposal of sewage rigorous enough?
- Car parking and number of cars on the site
- The proposed finish is different to the illustration that accompanies the application
- Access on to the road this site accesses on to the main A361 downhill in a 60 mph limit
- The plan is rather woolly and generally not well thought through
- There are inconsistencies in the application
- There is no footpath access except from the busy main A361
- The old driveway is still open this was supposed to be closed up once the new driveway was in situ
- The aspect is incorrect on the plans
- The scale of the building is out of sympathy with the surrounding area
- The proposed workshop/garage is too prominent
- The site elevation on the map is wrong

Locally we are changing the way we do things and again we have seen an example of this with our Community Youth Services. There is sometimes positive spin off with some efficiencies and one of these is the Melksham Community Area Youth Minibus which was purchased from Seend and which now ferries our youth around at minimal cost. However it is available for community use during term time and during the day. 

Carers' Week: 8th - 14th June 2015

A report from charities Carers UK and Age UK shows that the number of carers aged 85 and over in England has risen by 128% in ten years to over 87,000. Of these 6 in 10 are men, in contrast to the carer population as a whole (42% of all carers are men).

As your Good Neighbour Co-ordinator, I can provide information about the many local sources of help and support available to carers.
