Extract from a letter from Mark Cooper, Bramshaw Vicarage, March 13, 1850

"...Then let meetings be everywhere held in our cities and towns; let sermons be preached in every pulpit; let petitions pour in from every parish in the kingdom, until Sunday labour is and by the Post-office abolished, and abolished for ever.

The village of Seend, in the county, has set a noble example; in compliance with unanimous wish of the inhabitants, the Post Master-General has sanctioned, in that village, the cessation of the delivery of letters on the Lord's day...."
