Mr. William Willshire, Parish Clerk and Charmer of Warts

"White Witchery" we believe to be prevalent all over the world. The late Mr. William Willshire, for nearly sixty years parish clerk at Seend, was reputed to possess this gift of charming away warts, sprains, thorns, etc., and to have healed many persons, some of whom would come from quite a distance; his son, the present clerk, is said to inherit the gift. I do not think that they used an (at any rate audible) incantation. We understand that the gift is lost if money be given for the cure, if the secret be revealed, except at the time of death, or if the charm, or whatever it may be, wrapped up in parchment, be lost.

William Willshire and his family are listed in later census at Seend.

Kellys Directory of 1889 lists William Willshire, Parish Clerk and Shoemaker.

The 1891 census at High Street, Seend, lists:

William Willshire, head, widower, 83, Shoemaker.

Kellys Directory of 1903 lists his son, Joseph Edward Willshire, Parish Clerk and Sexton
