on Monday, August 3rd, 1896.

The following races will take place:-

S. and W. WILTS HUNT CUP. - 1st £10 (given by H. W. Harris, Esq., M.F.H.; 2nd, £5. For Hunters the bonafide property of Subscribers and Farmers residing within the S. and W. Wilts Hunt; the horses to have been the property of the Nominator two months previous to day of Race. The Race will be over hurdles and water jump. Horses to carry 12 stone. Thoroughbreds, 13 stone. About 2½ miles. Entrance, 10s.

GALLOWAY RACE - 1st, £8; 2nd, £2. For Galloways not exceeding 15 hands. 15 hands to carry 11 stone; 14½ hands, 10 stone; 14 hands, nine stone. About 2 miles. Entrance, 7s. 6d.

PONY RACE - 1st, £5, 2nd, £2. For Ponies not exceeding 14 hands. Heats and catch weights. About 1½ miles. Entrance 5s.

PONY RACE - 1st, £4; 2nd, £1. For Ponies not exceeding 13 hands. Heats and catch weights. About one mile. Entrance, 4s.

CONSOLATION RACE for beaten Ponies. - 1st, £1 1s.; 2nd, 10s. Catch weights. About one mile. Entrance free.

All Entries must be made, and Entrance Money paid, to Mr. T. C. Kirby, Railway Hotel, Semley, not later than July 30th, 1896. Jockeys' Colours to be declared at time of Entry.

The Stewards reserve to themselves the right of withdrawing any Prize for which they consider the Race has not been fairly run.

Four Horses, Galloways or Ponies, the property of different Owners to start, or the Race may be declared void at the option of the Stewards.
