## Kellys Directory Extract 1889 Shrewton

SHREWTON is a village and parish, situated on the road from Amesbury to Devizes, 6 miles west from Amesbury, 6 north from Wishford station on the Great Western railway and 11 north-west from Salisbury, in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Branch and Dole, Amesbury union, Salisbury county court district, petty sessional division of Salisbury and Amesbury, rural deanery of Wylye and archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury. The church of St. Mary is a building of flint and stone in the Norman and Early English styles, consisting of chancel, clerestoried nave of three bays, aisles, north porch and western tower containing 5 bells : it was rebuilt in 1854-5, and has 200 sittings: the chancel and north aisle each has a canopied piscina : the east and three other windows are stained. The register dates from the year 1548. The living is a vicarage, united with Maddington by Order in Council, 1870, gross yearly value £219, exclusive of 30 acres of glebe, with £120 allowed by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for a curate, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held since 1853 by the Rev. Frederick Bennett M.A. of Wadham College, Oxford, Canon and Prebendary of Salisbury, who resides at Maddington. Here are chapels for Wesleyans and Baptists. In 1704 Ann Estcourt, of Newnton, devised a rent charge, now amounting so £55, for apprenticing boys of the parishes of Newnton, Rollstone and Shrewton; at the inclosure of the parish 10 acres, producing £15 a year, were appropriated for the repairs of the church. In January, 1841, this village suffered severely by the flood which occurred here at that time. Charles Wansbrough esq. is lord of the manor, and resides at the Manor House. The principal landowners are Thomas Longman Mills esq., H. N. B. Good esq., Hugh Wyndham esq. of Rollstone House, and Charles Wansbrough esq. The soil is loam on chalk; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley, oats, turnips and some land in pasture. The area is 2,222 acres; rateable value, £1,664; the population in 1881 was 677.
