OPC Note:

Samuel Alder was on the same voyage as the Barnetts and Dunsdons from Steeple Ashton.

Other than being listed with the Barnett and Dunsdon families in the voyage's ledger, he doesn't have any other known links to Steeple Ashton.

** Samuel's PEF (perpetual emigrating fund) record indicates that he left his 1864 overland company somewhere along the Weber River (near Ogden, Utah).

In 1877 a list called "Names of Persons and Sureties Indebted to the Perpetual Emigrating Fund Company from 1850 to 1877" was created. This was a list of everyone who used PEF but had not paid their debt – Samuel Alder is listed. As part of the Jubilee year of the LDS Church, the "Worthy Poor" were forgiven their debt.
