OPC Note:

The Barnetts, also from Steeple Ashton, were on the same voyage as this group of Dunsdons, and included Virtue (Barnett) Dunsdon's widowed mother Ann Barnett (nee Berrett), her siblings George and Serena, and assorted nieces/nephews.

Two of James' uncles, Thomas Dunsdon and James Dunsdon, emigrated in 1849, along with their families.

There is another person listed with the Steeple Ashton contingent on the voyage's ledger, Samuel Alder. Samuel was from Trowbridge and doesn't have known links to Steeple Ashton, other than the ledger entry.

In 1884, James was baptised by Henry Kemp into the Reorganised Church of Latter-Day Saints (Called The Community of Christ since 2001). James' mother and sister also became members of the RLDS. The RLDS split from the original LDS after the death of founder/leader Joseph Smith. Doctrines differed, particularly about church leadership and polygamy (which was banned).

** Some records show that James and his sister Mary Ann were born in Woolwich, Kent, rather than Steeple Ashton. Their father John was in the army and stationed in Woolwich in 1841. This census indicates that none of his children were born in the county of Kent.

Mary Ann's Connection to Unsolved Iowa Murder Cases

George and Mary Ann's youngest daughter Lucy Ann was allegedly murdered by their great grandson Lyman Harvey Elefson (Lucy's grandson).

Lyman was suspected of poisoning his grandparents Lucy Ann (Kemp) Rhode and Alonzo Lyman Rhode, and his mother Winifred (Rhode) Elefson.

Lyman's step-great grandmother Anna Pearl (Erickson) Kemp (George's third wife) survived suspected poisoning.

After these incidents in 1948/49, investigations (inconclusive) were made into his father Harvey Elefson's death in 1941.

Lyman was never found guilty, due to lack of sufficient evidence even though he was with each person right before they became ill.
