## Domino's Pizza Staff Terrified By Raiders Armed With Meat Cleavers

Staff working late at a pizza outlet have been traumatised by a pair of robbers armed with meat cleavers who raided the store in Stratton and made away with cash from the till. In the early hours of Monday morning staff at Domino's Pizza, just off Windbrook Meadow, were getting ready to close for the night when the two men burst through the door, concealing their identity with scarves pulled over their faces. The staff on duty at the time were threatened with weapons which they believed to have been meat cleavers, but escaped from the incident uninjured. The robbers demanded money from the tills and made away with a small amount of cash for their efforts. Although attempts had been made to disguise their identity, the two offenders were described by witnesses as both white males, and aged between 30 and 35 years of age. Both had scarves over their mouths. One was around 5ft 8ins tall, and the other was taller, approximately 6ft in height. Police are appealing for any witnesses to the incident, or anyone who may know the identity of the armed robbers, to come forward with any information that might be relevant. The members of staff working at the time have been described as 'very shocked' by what had happened. A spokesman for Wiltshire Police said: Police are appealing for information regarding an armed robbery which took place in the early hours of Monday. At approximately 1am, two men entered Domino's Pizza, Windbrook Meadow, and threatened staff with what are believed to be meat cleavers. The men took a small amount of cash and left the store. Fortunately no one was hurt in the incident but the staff members were understandably very shocked. Domino's Pizza have refused to comment on the incident or the well-being and welfare of their members of staff. The next morning the store was having a new CCTV system fitted by contractors above the entrance to the shop.
