Stratton Community Festival

Crowds turned out for the second Stratton Community Festival on Meadowcroft Rec on the 6th July. The event was organised by Upper Stratton Baptist Church as part of the Parish Council's Stratton Festival programme. Around 2,000 people came along for the day – at least twice as many as the year before when people turned out to celebrate the churches 150th birthday. Chris Priddy, one of the team from USBC who put the day together said; "It was a brilliant day, the turn out was phenomenal, I spent a lot of time looking around in amazement at how many people had come along to enjoy a fantastic range of activities."

Throughout a very sunny afternoon people enjoyed a variety of different activities and displays including a performance from fire jugglers, Zumba Swindon and a falconry display from Birds4AllOccasions. There were also

many other static displays such as the Pinkertons Motorcycle Club's bikes and cruisers, a magic show, brass band performance, fairground rides, bouncy castles and the emergency services.

Vicki Hookings brought her whole family out to enjoy the day, and on the day she said "It's good, there is a lot of variety and they've enjoyed watching the fire display. We've only been here half an hour and they've got a lot out of it already."

Nythe to become separate parish

The Community Governance Review has now been completed by Swindon Borough Council and, despite the recommendations of the Cross Party Working Group, which recommended the retention of Nythe as part of the parish of Stratton St Margaret and the inclusion of 363 houses in the Headlands area into the parish, the community of Nythe will have its own separate Parish Council as from 1st April 2015 and the parish boundary in the Headlands area will not be changed.

Details on the final Nythe Parish Council boundary and the financial implications to the existing parish of Stratton St Margaret have not yet been made clear by the Borough, but the Parish Council is expecting to have its parish precept reduced by £88,000 from 2015/16 onwards.

The Parish Council is working hard to address the financial issues which it will face in the future and part of its forward planning is the current investment at Grange Leisure Centre. A new gym is being developed and will open its doors on 11th November 2013. A new all weather grass pitch is being constructed and a new café area will be added to the existing Foyer.

The Parish Council will do all it can to ensure that the remaining parishioners are not hit financially, but the Parish does have a large portfolio of existing responsibilities and an increase in the Council Tax may be unavoidable.

Focus on Honda (HUM) in Swindon

Today Honda is an integral part of Swindon providing employment, underpinning manufacturing locally and nationally and contributing to the community of Stratton St Margaret, South Marston and Swindon in general.

The site Honda now occupies started life in 1938 as a “shadow site” to support and supplement production of aircraft as the war approached in the event that other sites might be attacked and damaged. It was the clear choice of Phillips and Powis, which later became Miles, Aircraft Company and was ideal due to the large skilled workforce employed by Swindon’s GWR factory.

Two 1,000 yard concrete runways were constructed and painted with woodchip dipped in camouflage paint and concealed with pieces of entwined hedge to disguise the facility during the war. The first plane produced was the Miles Master training plane. Production reached 60 per month at its peak and over 1,000 were built prior to it being replaced by the four engines Stirling in 1942.

Production then switched to the Spitfire and although initially meant to modify the planes only, the site ended up producing 121 of the new Mark 21 Spitfires. At the end of the War the airfield was purchased by Vickers.



The last aeroplane completed on the site was the Scimitar Jet in January 1961 when production was shifted to manufacturing components for hovercraft and railway carriages.

In 1970 Honda entered a collaboration with Austin Rover and produced the Triumph Acclaim. In 1980, Honda



purchased the Vickers site and adapted the runway into a test track, demolished the aviation factory and constructed a 1.5 million square foot car plant.

The factory started out life carrying out pre-inspections on models such as Concerto, Ballade, Accord, Legend, Integra and Prelude. Vehicles manufactured at Austin Rover’s Cowley Plant and imported from Japan underwent pre delivery inspections at the Swindon plant. Soon the plant began to manufacture panels for the Ballade and production began in the new Engine Plant producing engines for the Honda Concerto and Rover 200/400s.

At 11am on 8th October 1992 the first car built at HUM was driven off the production line in Car Plant 1 and marked the beginning of car production at the Swindon Plant. In 1994 the first Honda Civic was produced. By 1999 ¼ million Accords and ½ million cars in total had been produced at the site. By 2001 the plant was manufacturing the Honda CR-V and Car Plant 2 had opened and commenced production. This period was an exciting time of growth, change and maturation for a local manufacturing

facility that was making a name for itself around the world.

By 2003 a million vehicles and 1.5 million engines had been manufactured at the Swindon plant. In September 2006 500,000 CR-Vs had been produced and in 2007 the millionth Civic rolled off the production line.

However, in 2009, with the economic downturn, the factory was forced to close for a four month period. When it reopened the Honda Jazz had been added to the production range. But in 2011 natural disasters affected Honda globally and production moved to a 2 day week due to severely limited supplies following the earthquake and tsunami in Japan and further production disruptions were experienced in November following the flooding in Thailand.

In September 2012 the European CR-V was launched and an investment of £267 million into the plant for the new model introduction covering the Honda Civic, CR-V and the new 1.6 small diesel developments.

Despite the sad news of redundancies in January 2013 Honda has continued to be an important part of our community and has continued to invest and support the area.

Improving local woodland for the people of Swindon to enjoy

The Woodland Trust and Swindon Borough Council are working together on an exciting project to enhance both Stratton Wood and Stanton Park. Work carried out so far has improved existing, and created new, paths and improved the access onto Kingsdown Lane which links the two sites. A volunteers' day was held at the end of March and, even battling with the snow, ten keen volunteers made a real difference to the woodland.

Sarah Stebbing, the Woodland Trust Area Manager for Wiltshire, is delighted with the outcome of the new partnership. "The volunteers worked really hard and did a fantastic job. The combination of hedge laying and scrub clearance by the volunteers will not only result in a



hedge that is better for wildlife but will hopefully go some way to preventing access by horses and motorbikes."

Stratton Woods update: pathworks, ponds and planting all underway



First we upgraded and improved the well worn paths and access routes into Stratton Wood and now we have just created four small ponds. Within a couple of days of being dug, wildlife had moved in – with sightings of broad bodied chaser dragonflies, peacock butterflies and large white butterflies. Over the coming months the largest pond will be planted with water plants with some wildflowers planted around the edges of all the ponds. These ponds will be seasonal so the amount in them will depend on how much rain we get during each season.

A number of fruit trees will be planted this autumn to create a small orchard. This will provide a source of food for a number of species – but this will also provide fruit for local people to use in future years. 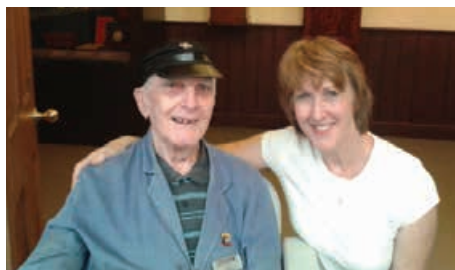
Swindon 105.5

SWINDON 105.5 is the town's Community Radio service, totally local and broadcasting 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and based in Stratton.

As a non-commercial service, the Station relies on fundraising, grants, donations and Friends to enable the delivery of its service to the community, which invariably sees almost 120 volunteers, aged 10-78 involved. In the past year it has seen a Ministerial visit, regular visits from the town's MPs, Police and Crime Commissioner, Lord Lieutenant and High Sheriff. In July, members were invited to a Westminster celebration of adult learning which included an audience with HRH Princess Anne.

A diverse range of opportunities are provided both on and off air. Current projects include working with local individuals, schools and communities, capturing local history and heritage. Over 20 hours of Heritage programming is currently being produced focussing on the town's buildings. These will be broadcast on air and on the website where they will stay for posterity.

Providing training opportunities is at the core of the Station's ethos. Pictured,

John Foley meets Don Rogers

Update on John Foley, Chair of Council

On Thursday 12th September 2013 Cllr John Foley, Chairman of Stratton St Margaret Parish Council, was taken to hospital where it was discovered that he had a burst aneurism which had bled into his stomach. John was transferred to the Gloucester Royal Infirmary where he was operated on. John's condition was extremely serious.

However, John began to slowly recover and he was finally transferred to the Great Western Hospital on Sunday 27th September. Since then John has been making excellent progress, despite having a chest infection, and he is feeling much better.

His wife, Eileen Foley, also a Councillor on Stratton St Margaret Parish Council, said; "The staff at Gloucester Royal Infirmary saved John's life. We owe them such a lot. Although John is still on a ventilator he is getting up and the staff at the Great Western have been absolutely marvellous. The family would like to express its sincere thanks to all the NHS staff at both the Gloucester Royal Infirmary and the Great Western Hospital for their care, kindness and support. Words cannot express our gratitude."

The Vice Chair of Stratton St Margaret Parish Council, Cllr David Roberts, said; "All the members and staff of the Parish Council have been very concerned and wish John a very speedy recovery. We look forward to welcoming him back when he is fully recovered."
