decease alsoe tenn pounds more six years after my decease Also I give and bequeath to ffrancis Brunsdon, Austin Painter, William Willmott, Margaret Smith, widdowe, Agnes Stevens, widdowe, to each of them liveing in Stratton aforesayd twelve pence apeece to be paid to them upon the death of my buriall from I give to my daughters Elizabeth and Susannah to each of them a pewter platter Item I give and bequeath to my sonne Tobie Richman the residue of my goods and Chattells whome I make my full and whole Executor And I desyre my loving Neighbours Henry Smart and John Hering the elder to bee Overseers of this my last will and testament in witnesses whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seale William Richman his marke in the presence of these *Christopher John - Henry Smart*— John Hering his marke
