## Sutton Benger

FOUR miles from Chippenham and 6 from Malmesbury, Sutton Benger is in the Chippenham Division of Wilts, Chippenham Union, Petty Sessional Division and County Court District, and Diocese of Bristol. The register of the Church of All Saints dates from 1653. The living is a rectory, gross yearly value £350, with residence, is in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Salisbury. The Ecclesiastical Commissioners now make a grant of £15 per year to this living. There is a Church School here for 80 children. The area is 1,288 acres; rateable value, £1,805; population, 327. Letters arrive from Chippenham which is the nearest railway station. There is a Money Order, Telegraph and Telephone Office in the village. The post closes week days at 10.30 a.m. and 8.30 p.m.
