**Henry SNOOK      July, 1842**

INQUESTS HELD BY GEORGE SYLVESTER, Esq.

At Sutton Mandeville, on the 18<sup>th</sup> inst., on the body of Henry Snook, aged 73. The deceased entered the Union Workhouse at Tisbury, and left it the following day, when he told some of his late neighbours he should drown himself: being missed, his son discovered him, two days after, in Planter's water, in the above named parish. His spirits had for some time been much depressed, his speech incoherent, and habits unusual.

Verdict - *Insanity*
