FURIOUS DRIVING

Sidney Holloway and William John Jay, two boys, were summoned for driving a horse and cart furiously at Sutton Mandeville, on the 13th inst. Police-constable Carter stated that Holloway was driving the first cart at the rate of 10 or 12 miles an hour, and Jay was driving at full gallop. Both were driving furiously so as to endanger the lives of passengers, and the road was very narrow. Defendants were fined 5s. and costs each. – Albert Hunt was summoned for a similar offence, committed on the same day, at Sutton Mandeville, and was convicted in a like penalty.
