1531	Johannes Colyns (Or Collins) M.A. and Fellow of Exeter College, Oxon.	1534 – <i>Submission of Clergy Act abolishing Papal Authority</i> 1535 – Act of Supremacy – the King legally Head of the Church 1535 – The Incumbent made to return to Valor Ecclesiastics – a survey of the income & value of benefices. 1535 – Archbishop Coverdale's translation of the Bible 1535 – July 7 th , <i>Martyrdom of Sir Thomas ore.</i> 1536 – Calvin's Institutes of Christian Religion published. 1536 – Suppression of the Monasteries began. 1537 – The Incumbent became Rector of Rushall, and in 1538 – he was executed for treason.

1549	Johannes Clement	1549 – <i>First Prayer Book under the First Act of Uniformity forbidding the use of the Roman Catholic Mass.</i> 1552 – Cranmer's Book of Common Prayer (second & more Protestant) 1552 – The XLII Articles of Belief 1556 – Cranmer burnt. 1559 – Second Act of Uniformity – Church of England established a new amended Prayer Book. 1563 – The XXXIX Articles & in 1571 Article 29 restored.
1564	Henricus Crosse B.A. Oxon	1566 – Archbishop Parker's "Book of Advertisements" regulating Clergy dress 1576 – Date of the Parish Chalice 1588 – Defeat of the Spanish Armada 1602 – The Parish's Churchwarden's Accounts began 1611 – Authorised version of the Bible
	Thomas Sangar	1615 & 1616 – Two of the bells cast (or re-cast). Date of oldest bell unknown.
1630 - 1645	Gabriel Sangar M.A. Magdalen College, Oxon.	1631 – <i>Date of the Church's Pulpit</i> 1647 – Revd. Mr Sangar became Rector of Chilmark & in 1648 – 69 Rector of St. Martins in the Fields, London (died 1678) 1648 – The Parish's Paten made (purchased in ___) 1649 – Execution of Charles I 1652 (Sept. 29) Act for reform & Maintenance of Parish Registers (Dec.16) Oliver Cromwell declared Lord Protector. 1654 – Sutton Mandeville Parish Registers began
1657	Thomas Rosewell M.A. Pembroke College, Oxon.	1662 – Ejected from the Parish for non-conformity 1685 – Convicted of treason by Judge Jefferies but pardoned by the King
1662	Augustine Hayter M.A. New College, Oxon.	1663 – Third Act of Uniformity excludes Dissenters from C. of E. 1665 – The Great Plague 1668 – James II flees after failure to protect Roman Catholics 1709 – Top of Church Tower added 1709 (Dec. 21) The Incumbent was buried
1709	Guilielmus Anderson B.A. St. John's Coll., Cantab.	1714 (Nov. 3) The Incumbent died

1714	Daniel Stockwell B.A. Wadham College, Oxon.	1726 – Thos. Smith, Curate 1729 – The Incumbent became Rector of Earl Soham, Suffolk.
1729	Willelmus Lamplugh M.A. St. John's Coll., Cantab.	1734 – Flagon "Given by Mrs Catherine Long, widow." 1737 – (Nov. 24) The Incumbent died
1737	Henry Fricker M.A. Wadham College, Oxon.	1765 – N. Waterman, Curate 1780 – (April 17) Yew tree planted 1787-9 – John Evans, Curate 1789 – French Revolution 1792 (Nov. 9) The Incumbent died aged 82.
1793	James Hibberd B.A. Hertford College, Oxon.	1831 (March 28) The Incumbent died aged 64.
1831 - 1839	Wadham Knatchbull M.A. Christ Church, Oxon.	1834-4 – J. E. Baker, Officiating Minister 1833 – The Old Rectory built by the Patron, William Wyndham of Dinton Park.
1840	John Wyndham M.A. Magdalen College, Oxon.	<i>1851 (Dec.) Bracher Coal Charity – Mrs Mary Bracher, late of "Panthurst" (now "Panthers") bequeathed £80; the interest was to be given to the poor of the Parish.</i> 1862 – Church restored and enlarged: Sir Giles Gilbert Scott Architect. 1869 – Glebe Cottage rebuilt by Rev. John Wyndham. 1875 – Former school built. 1885 – Revised Version of Bible 1887 (June 22) Village Jubilee Celebrations took place. 1897 – Tower strengthened and Bells rehung. 1897 (Sept. 6) The Incumbent died aged 85.
1897	William Willimott M.A. Corpus Christi, Cantab.	1899 (Aug. 11) The Incumbent, lately having resigned, died at Ipswich aged 75.
1899	Guy Julian Bridges F.R.G.S., F.R.Met. Soc. Chichester College	1903 (Dec. 18) The Incumbent died aged 40.
1904	Thomas Heathcote Wyndham Sarum College	1911 – Churchyard enlarged 1912 – (June 22) The Incumbent, lately having resigned, died at Salisbury aged 67.
1911	William Louis Walter B.A. London; Univ. of Kiel; M.A. St. John's College, Cantab.	1915 – Chiming apparatus installed 1932 – Allotments Charity 1942 – New Churchyard consecrated 1955 (October) Electric light installed 1958 (Jan. 17) The Incumbent died aged 89.

1959	John Eric Blanchett M.A. Queen's Coll., Cantab.	1959 – Pews and floor removed on South side of Church 1964 – North Aisle reroofed & repairs made to Transept roof. 1967 – North slope of Chancel reroofed & Chancel redecorated. <i>1970 – Remainder of interior redecorated.</i> 1971 – Repairs to Tower roof. 1974 (Aug. 31) The Incumbent retired (the last fully beneficed Rector).
1974	Kenneth Cantlay Cooper M.A. Queen's Coll., Cantab.	1974 (Dec. 2) Licensed as Curate in Charge. 1976 – Oak table made for Vestry 1979 – Brass altar cross given & oak plinth made for it. Chancel floor reconstructed. Pews removed, repaired and replaced. 1982 – Extensive repairs to Tower roof: lead replaced by stainless steel. Repairs to Transept ceiling. 1982 (Oct. 31) Curate in Charge retired.
1982 - 1984	Interregnum	<i>1st November 1982 to 7th August 1984</i> <i>1983 (Nov. 6) Churchwardens __ dedicated to Church.</i> 1983-4 Repairs to Tower fabric
1984	Charles John Goulding Sarum College	1984 (May 8) Licensed at St. George's Church, Fovant to officiate in the Nadder Group with particular care for Fovant and Sutton Mandeville. 1986 (Jan. 28) Revd. C. J. Goulding resigned.
