John LAMB

John Lamb was born in Yorkshire, England around 1918.

Sapper John Lamb was attached to Royal Engineers & resided at London SW at the time he enlisted. His service number was 6212773.

The Royal Engineers saw combat throughout the Second World War, their skills being put to extensive use in the fields of bomb disposal, mine detection, bridge building, maintaining railways, roads, water supply etc. They trained at the Royal Engineers Depot in Chatham or the RE Mounted Depot at Aldershot.

Sapper John Lamb died on 29th January, 1944.

A death for John Lamb, aged 26, was registered in the March quarter, 1944 in the district of Mere, Wiltshire, England.

Sapper John Lamb was buried at Sutton Mandeville Cemetery (West Part). His death is acknowledged by Commonwealth War Graves Commission & as such he has a CWGC headstone.
