

SWALLOWCLIFT is a village and parish, in the Southern division of the county, Tisbury union, Dunworth hundred, Hindon petty sessional division, Shaftesbury county court district, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and rural deanery of Chalke, one mile and three quarters from Tisbury railway station, and 8 miles north-east from Shaftesbury. The church of St. Peter is a stone building in the Norman style, erected in 1844; it has a chancel, nave, and transept, a large porch, and square tower containing 3 bells: here is a very handsome east window of stained glass, the gift of Lady Herbert of Lea in memory of her husband the late Lord Herbert, and one at the west end to the memory of G. G. Blandford, esq. The register bears date 1738. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £80, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held by the Rev. John Harman Samler, M.A., of Pembroke College, Oxford, incumbent of Ansty. Here is a National school. In 1662 the common lands of the parish were enclosed, when a certain portion thereof, called the Poor land, was set apart for the benefit of the poor of this parish for ever, and yields the annual sum of £30, which is distributed yearly. The Earl of Pembroke is lord of the manor. The principal landowners are the Earl of Pembroke and James Hillier Shorland, esq. The soil is sandy; subsoil sandstone. The chief crops are wheat, oats, and barley, and pasturage. The area is 1,344 acres, and the population in 1871 was 361.
