March 16 1846

Wheat still came to hand rather out of condition, which checked sales: prices must be quoted the same as last week for every description of grain. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 19 March 1846**

September 28 1846

A good supply of Wheat, which sold readily, at an advance of 2s. to 3s. per quarter. A little new Barley offering, but higher prices were asked for middling qualities than buyers would give. Beans and Peas fully as dear. Wheat from 44s. to 64s; Barley 32s. to 43s.; Beans 40s to 50s.; Oats 26s to 34s.; Peas 40s. to 56s. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, October 1 1846**

September 20 1847

A much larger supply than of late. Sellers asked higher prices than buyers would give, and only about half the Wheat was sold, at an advance of 5s. to 10s. per quarter from last week. There appeared but little demand for other grain, and prices may be quoted at last week. Wheat, from 50s. to 66s. per quarter; Barley 25s. to 34s.; Oats 22s. to 31s.; Beans, 46s. to 56s. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 23 September 1847**

October 25 1847

A good supply; wheat sold slowly, at a decline of 1s. to 2s. per quarter. Barley was a very dull sale, at 3s. to 4s. per quarter less than last week. Beans, peas, and oats, fully as dear. Wheat from 42s. to 57s. per qr., barley, 30s. to 35s., beans, 50s. to 56s., peas, 44s. to 60s., oats, 22s. to 28s. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday 28 October 1847, Page 3 Col. 5**
