

Obituary of Alice Maud McDonagh of Swindon

The funeral tool place yesterday morning of Mrs. Alice Maude McDonagh, wife of Mr. P. McDonagh, of 85 Beatrice Street, Swindon, who died on 15 January, aged 64. At 8 a.m. on Thursday, Requiem Mass was held at Holy Rood Church, where the body had rested overnight, and interment was at Radnor Street cemetery.
