In the Name of God Amen I John Hussey of Tytcombe in the countie of Wilts yeoman, being sicke in body, but of perfect Remembrance Thanckes be gyven to God Doe make my last Will and Testament in manner and forme followinge ffirst I bequeath my Sowle to Almightie God my Maker and redeemer hopinge by the passion of Jesus Christ with an unfeyned repentance for my Sinnes to injoye Liefe everlastinge, ffirst touching the disposition of my worldlie goods, I doe bequeath in manner followinge, Imprimis I gyve to my Servante John Hussey now dwellinge with me Twentie Marke of Lawfull english money, to be paid unto him at the feast of St Michaell The archangel next ensuing after my decease Item I gyve six shillings Eight pence to be buryed in the pishe Church of Titcombe Item I give a bushell of wheate to Mr Gryffin Curat of the parishe of Titcombe; Item I give Tenne shillings to them of great Bedwin that have of late susteyned losse by ffyer To be distributed amongst them by the direction of the Church wardens & overseers of the same parishe of greate Bedwin I gyve to my daughter Anne one hundred poundes of Lawfull English money to be paide unto her when she shall attaine unto eighteene yeares of age Item I gyve to Thomas Hussey of the broile and Cooper of Burroughe Close the thyrdes of the of a grounde called Herbertes beinge in Burrowclere equallie to be divided betwene them, all the @Wiltshire OPC Project/2014/Ros Dunning

resydue of my goods Chattells and debts moveable and unmoveable not bequeathed I give to Mary my wief whom I make my Executrix of this my last Will and Testament In witnes whereof I have hereunto Sett my hand or marke this nyneteenth day of maye A thousand ffyve hundred nyntie nyne; Memorandum that I make John Plotte (?) of Titcombe overseer of this my Last will and Testament The marke of John Hussey Subscribed the day and yeare above written in the presence of us *Richard Noyle and me John Grufith Curat of Titcombe John Aldar*
