

Barry Shooting Affair

Death of Wounded Lance-Corporal

Father and Mother Present at the End

Lance Corporal Gerald Burton Woodhouse, of the Royal Ordnance Corps, the victim of the shooting affair at Barry Camp early last Saturday morning, died in Dundee Royal Infirmary about half-past six o'clock last evening.

His father and mother were present when he died.

When he was admitted to the Infirmary Lance Corporal Woodhouse was in a critical condition from abdominal injuries, and his chance of recovery was from the first regarded as practically hopeless.

Child a Week Old

Lance Corporal Woodhouse, who was 25 years of age, was married, and leaves a widow and two children, the second child being only a week old.

He resided at Collingbourne Kingston, near Marlborough, Wiltshire, and his remains will be interred at Tidworth, Wiltshire.

Private Roland Frederick Wood, also of the Royal Ordnance Corps is in custody in connection with the shooting affair. He appeared for declaration before Sheriff Malcolm at Dundee on Monday, the charge against him at that time being that he stole a rifle and ammunition and discharged the rifle at Lance Corporal Woodhouse and attempted to murder him. He was committed to Perth Prison, but will now be brought back to Dundee for further legal proceedings.

Private Wood, who is 19 years of age, belongs to Portsmouth.
