

TILSHEAD is a township, parish, and village, 10 miles from Amesbury north-west, and 4 from Lavington south, in The Hundred of Branch and Pole, and Amesbury Union. The living is a vicarage, the rectory being a lay one, value £220, in the gift of the Lord Chancellor; the Rev. Joseph Holden Johnson, M. A., is the present incumbent. The church, rededicated to St. Thomas a Beckett, is at least 800 years old, with square tower and 3 bells. The church was reendowed in 1319, when it received Adam de Newnham, the first resident minister; it has recently been repaired and enlarged, and is in the Norman style of architecture. In 1851, the population was 523; the acreage, 3,756a. 3r. 26p. Here is a National school. Here are the embankment called OLD DITCH, and several barrows, among which are Long Barrow, White Barrow, Silver Barrow, and Kill Barrow.
