VAD Attachment at Tisbury Vicarage WWI

A Red Cross detachment was founded in 1914 by Mrs. Walter Shaw-Stewart of the second Fonthill Abbey, in a hut off Hindon Lane.

During the years 1915 to 1918, the detachment staffed a military hospital at Tisbury Vicarage.

Until the construction of a hospital at the Fovant Camp in 1915, operations were carried out here.
