



Theft from a Till

Tisbury Petty Sessions

James Snook, labourer, of Tisbury, was summoned for stealing 4s.6d., the money of George Hollis, of the Crown Hotel, Tisbury, on July 21st. Maria Hollis, wife of the prosecutor, stated that on the day named, at about 6 p.m., she heard the rattling of money in the bar and going there she saw the defendant with his hand in the till grasping some silver. She caught hold of his hand and he then dropped the money. He had had two pints of beer but was not drunk.

Defendant's statement was that he did not know what he was doing. He wished to be dealt with summarily, and was fined £1 and 18s. cost.
